1. Network Connection


Method 1: Physical Connection

The Ethernet cable is plug-and-play and does not require any additional setup.

Method 2: Setting up WIFI

The Micro SD card has a FAT32 partition recognized by the computer, and under this partition, there is a configuration file named "system.cfg".

Please modify WIFI_SSID and WIFI_PASSWD in "system.cfg" according to your desired WiFi settings.



2. Power on:

Connect a power supply to your BTT Pi's USB power port.



3. Ready to go:

Simply wait for about 3 minutes for the BTT PI's system to start up and automatically run the application. Once the green light is on, the system is ready to use.

4. Plug your 3D Printer:

Power on your 3D printer, plug one end of the USB cable to your 3D printer, and the other end to the USB port on the BTT Pi



5. Plug Camera:

Plug one camera into the USB port on the BTT Pi.



6. Type Access Code:

To connect to Cloud 3D Print, scan the QR code affixed to the BTT Pi using a mobile app or enter the access code on the Setup Wizard or Device page of your web browser. Make sure your device is turned on before attempting to connect with the Cloud 3D Print software.
